Our findings showed that providing access to a community-based, family-centred early intervention program that includes training and education to caregivers of children with developmental disabilities leads to reduced caregiver strain, including emotional, personal, physical, financial and family burden and lead to increased family empowerment and wellbeing. Caregivers of children with disabilities face higher demands than caregivers of children who do not have disabilities, particularly in low- and middle-income contexts, because of financial difficulties, challenges accessing care, time required for caregiving duties, perceived and experienced stigma, discrimination in the community and/or within families, and the physical burden of care.

Amar Seva Sangam and Handi-Care Intl. has provided access to Early Intervention to thousands of children and their caregivers within their own homes and communities by leveraging technology using the locally developed EI.
